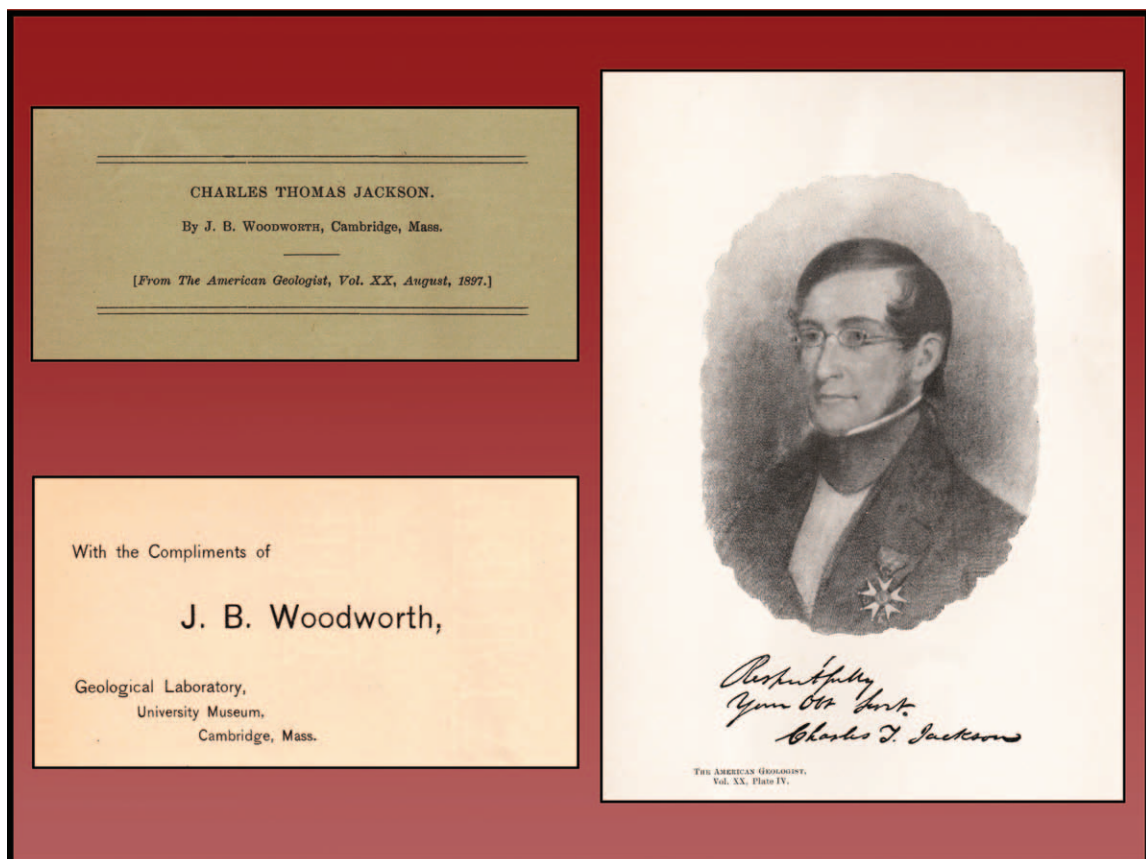


ANESTHESIOLOGY REFLECTIONS FROM THE WOOD LIBRARY-MUSEUM

An instructor in Geology at Harvard, Jay Backus Woodworth (1865–1925) published an article (*upper left*) titled “Charles Thomas Jackson” in *The American Geologist* about the life and works of that geological surveyor and ether pioneer. This publication included Jackson’s portrait (*right*) above a copy of his handwritten “Respectfully / Your Obt. Servt. / Charles T.
