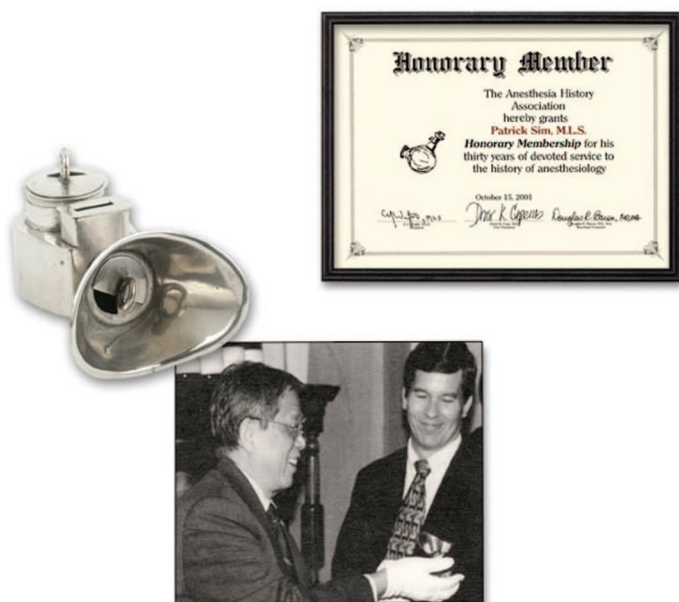


## The Irish Connections of Patrick Sim, M.L.S.



**Patrick P. Sim, MLS (1939 - 2010)**

Decades before he would be celebrated as the American Society of Anesthesiologists' Paul M. Wood Distinguished Librarian Emeritus, a young boy named Sim Pui-Kam matriculated at Hong Kong's famous St. Joseph's College, a Catholic boys' school where most classes were taught in English (*i.e.*, English with an Irish accent). The Lasallian Brothers who ran the school were mostly Irishmen, so, naturally, they christened the young man "Patrick" Pui-Kam Sim. In 2001 Sim was granted an Honorary Membership in the Anesthesia History Association, one of whose council members would donate a Murphy Chloroform Inhaler to the Wood Library-Museum (WLM) in honor of "Irish" Patrick Sim.
